

# CORNISH HILL ROAD BRIDGE PROJECT, WARREN COUNTY

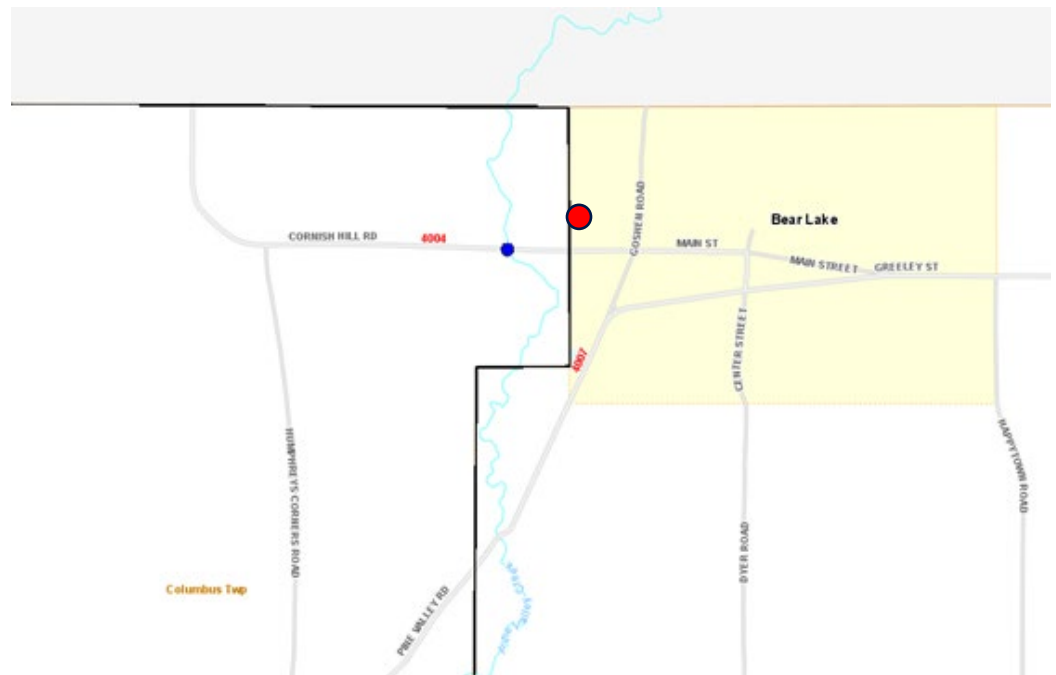
## PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The proposed scope of work includes a superstructure replacement of the structure that carries Cornish Hill Road (Route 4004) over Pine Valley Brook in Columbus Township, Warren County.

The existing concrete adjacent box beam bridge was built in 1987. It is rated in poor condition. Approximately 220 vehicles a day use the bridge, on average.

## PROJECT AREA

The bridge is located on Cornish Hill Road (Route 4004) approximately ½ mile west of the intersection with Pine Valley Road (State Route 4007).



## PROPOSED PLAN

Work will involve replacing the adjacent box beam bridge with spread box beams on the existing abutments. No major change in roadway grade anticipated, which will include shoulder backup. The existing pavement will be milled and overlaid to tie into the proposed structure. No right-of-way acquisition anticipated.

## ANTICIPATED CONSTRUCTION/STUDY SCHEDULE

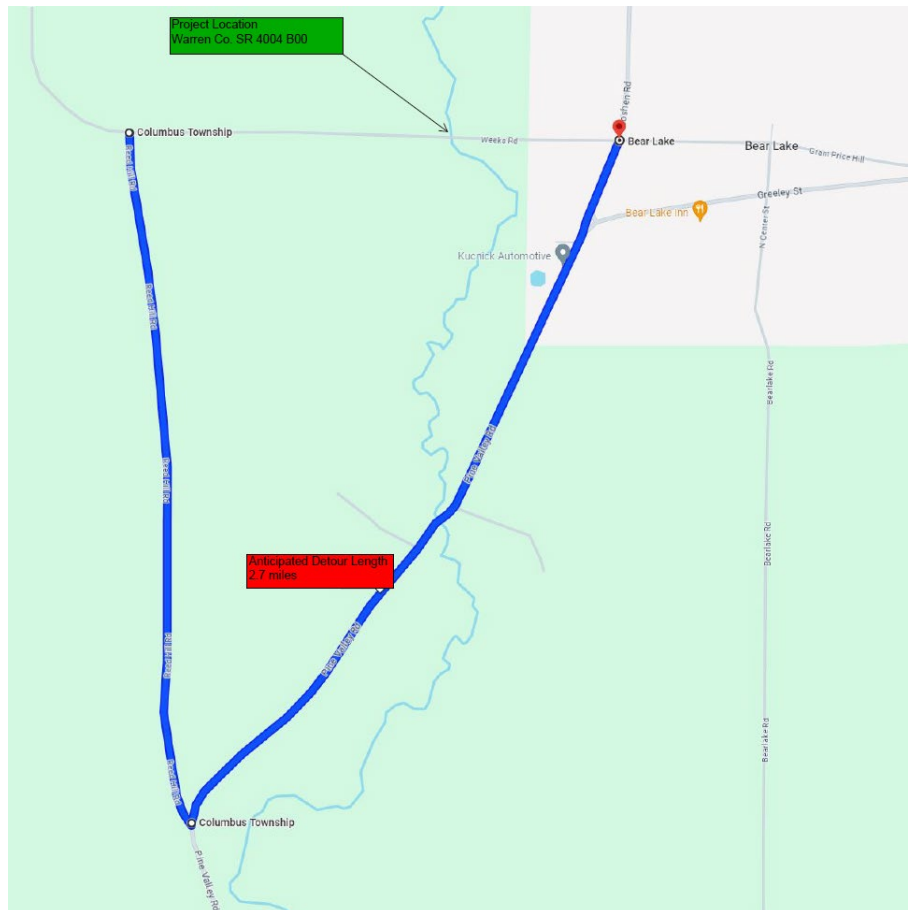
Work is expected to occur during the 2025 construction season.

## TRAFFIC IMPACTS

A detour will be required during construction and is expected to be in place for approximately four months.

The proposed 16.6-mile detour will be posted using Pine Valley Road and Humphreys Corners.



## CONSTRUCTION FUNDING

The estimated construction cost is \$300,000-\$600,000. This project is funded at least in part by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL).

## CURRENT PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

The purpose of the public comment period is to introduce the project and receive input regarding any questions or concerns with the project. It is also an opportunity for the public to review and comment on the project's potential effect upon Cultural Resources pursuant to the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation's 36 CFR Part 800 regulations implementing Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act. The project documents can be made available in alternative languages or formats if requested.
